Donors sort and clean garbage from home WASTE COLLECTION

The clean garbage is deposited into the house of worship and put into a box of trash according to its category



WASTE SALE

Waste that has been separated by category is sold to offtakers or the nearest Waste Bank

UTILIZATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF PROFITS FROM WASTE DONATION

Funds from the waste donation will be channeled through programs, such as] mosque construction, compensation for the poor, orphans & widows around places of worship, etc.

RECORDING OF WASTE COLLECTION AND SALES

The amount of waste collected and the results of the sale of waste are recorded







The mosque around the Bekasi River


- 1 waste bank will accompany 2 mosques for waste sorting education

- The dedicated house of worship around the Bekasi River will become an education center for the community in managing and sorting waste by applying GRADATION

GRADASI : Collaboration with Siklus Refill

- Siklus Refill is one of the winner of Ending Plastic Pollution Innovation Challenge (EPPIC).
- The refill cycle will operate around the pilot mosque environment and works together to provide education to the public to reduce sachet packaging waste.



GRADASI : What's Next?

GRADASI : Bulkstore at Baitul Makmur Bekasi as a Pilot Mosque



- Baitul Makmur Mosque will become a pilot zero-waste house of worship in Bekasi.
- The pilot mosque will become a learning center for waste management, both inorganic and organic waste.

Challenges

- Experts/trainers are needed to conduct training for house of worship administrators
- Fulfillment of needs in the form of facilities for Unit Mosques, among others in the form of:
 - Trash alms box
 - Garbage scale
